MEMO TO: CHIEF OF POLICE B.F. McCALL:

At a meeting of the Village Board of Trustees held Tuesday Evening, September 8th, 1936 on motion regularly moved, seconded and carried Officer Joseph L. Heike was restored to duty, effective September 9th, 1936, he to report for duty September 10th, 1936. Officer Robert W. Stone relieved of assignment to take Officer Heike's place during his sick leave and to continue as Temporary Patrolman to the end of the vacation period in the Police Department. On motion regularly moved, seconded and carried Officer John McBride's services to terminate through September 9th, 1936.

On motion regularly moved, seconded and carried a resolution was adopted effective June 6th, 1936 that the pay and grades of the patrolmen of the Police Department of the Village of Irvington be revised as follows:
